What we've been up to.....

Meetings with Councillors

ABE co-convenors Brett Stevenson & Bernie O'Neil met with Mayor Innes on Monday 1 March on the understanding that she would be standing for re-election. However Councillor Innes, who was accompanied at the meeting by Council's General Manager, would not confirm whether she would be a candidate in September's council elections. So the meeting was brief and the Mayor was invited to contact ABE again if, and when, she decides to stand for re-election.

On 29 March, ABE met with Deputy Mayor Rob Pollock, who confirmed he will be seeking re-election. Councillor Pollock identified his three main issues for the Council leading up to the September election as completing the Bateman's Bay Regional Aquatic Arts and Leisure Centre; completing the link road from Bateman's Bay through Malua Bay and improving coordination of tourism across the shire. The new Eurobodalla Hospital was also mentioned as an important issue.

On 31 March, ABE met with Councillor Anthony Mayne, who also intends to stand for re-election. Councillor Mayne's priority issues are improving transparency in Council decision-making and ways of conducting Council business; adopting best practice, informed development across the shire; and employment growth in Eurobodalla with a view to supporting jobs of the future.

More information about these, and other candidates, will appear on the 'Candidates' page of the ABE website (abettereurobodalla.org) in the coming weeks as we continue to meet with current councillors who intend to stand again, as well as new candidates who will be standing for the first time.

On Friday 26 March ABE wrote to Council asking what changes will be made to the \$70 million+ Batemans Bay Regional Aquatic Arts and Leisure Centre so that it can also serve as an evacuation centre. This letter and Council's response will be posted on our website.

The non-resident electoral roll is now open for non-resident property owners or lessees to register to vote. Registration forms are available on Eurobodalla Council's website. For an **individual owner or lessee**, then this is the correct form to use. For multiple owners or lessees, just one of the owners or lessees needs to be nominated to go on the electoral roll, and this is the correct form to use.

As Eurobodalla Shire is not divided up into wards, ignore the questions on these forms which mention wards.

Please note that the forms on Council's website are normal PDF files which cannot be edited, so they must be printed out before being manually filled in. ABE has created editable versions of these files that can be filled in electronically and these are available on our website here and here. Council has advised that digital signatures cannot be used on the editable forms, so once filled in, the forms need to be printed out for signing before being scanned and emailed, or posted, to Council.

Registration forms can be submitted up until ${\bf 26^{th}}$ July ${\bf 2021}$, but it is advisable to get them in well before this date.
